At St Laurence Church, our Lady Chapel provides a peaceful space for prayer, reflection, and connection. Whether you're familiar with prayer or just exploring it, we offer a few different ways to engage.

You are welcome to light a candle at our candle stand, a visual reminder that your prayers are offered to God. Alternatively, you can write or draw your prayer and hang it on our prayer tree. If you'd like your prayer to be included during Sunday worship, a prayer folder is available in the chapel, it is located on the alter table. Please ensure you have permission if including someone's name.

If you're unsure whether your prayer is suitable for public worship, lighting a candle or using the prayer tree may feel more personal. You're also welcome to simply sit in silence and be still before God—being present is a prayer in itself. For those wishing to speak with someone, our prayer ministry team is available every Sunday between 10:30 and 11:00 a.m.

St Laurence Church, Alvechurch, Tower Project (Phase 2) awarded grant by The National Lottery Heritage Fund to restore the church tower.



Press Release

St Laurence Church in Alvechurch is delighted to announce a £189,000 grant from The National Lottery Heritage Fund. This will provide 2/3 of the cost of the work necessary to protect and conserve the church's rich heritage, with a focus on completing essential works to restore the church tower and clock face, securing their preservation for future generations.

The grant will enable the restoration of these key historical features, ensuring the iconic tower and clock face continue to be prominent landmarks within the community. Additionally, the project will aim to invite wider interaction, allowing both locals and visitors to engage more deeply with the church's architectural and cultural heritage.

The funding, made possible thanks to National Lottery players, will also help create a sustainable future for the church, promoting wider appreciation of its historical significance while ensuring it remains a vital community hub for years to come.

St Laurence Church is a Grade II* listed building, with the Tower forming the oldest part of the structure as it stands today. Without this vital support from The National Lottery Heritage Fund, the tower would continue to decay and become unusable. This would mean the loss of the rhythm of time marked by the clock chimes, and the bells would fall silent due to the building becoming unsafe for use. Without intervention, this treasured heritage, and rhythm could be lost forever.

The restoration project will focus on preserving the historic tower and clock face, which are vital components of the Grade II* listed building. By halting the current decay, this project will safeguard the architectural integrity of the church and ensure that its historic significance remains intact for future generations. The church's heritage as a central landmark in the community, with its tower dating back centuries, will be restored and protected, keeping the cultural legacy alive.

The project acknowledges the diverse environment of the church and churchyard throughout the restoration process. Efforts will be made to contribute to the long-term preservation of existing natural and built resources, aligning with environmental conservation efforts.

The restoration will create opportunities for the local community to engage with their heritage through workshops, guided tours, and educational programs. By enhancing awareness and participation, the project will ensure that a broader audience can appreciate the church's cultural and historical importance.

The funding will support the development of a sustainable future for St Laurence Church by creating plans to ensure its ongoing maintenance and operation. The church's ability to remain a functional space for both worship and community activities will be strengthened, enhancing its role as a community hub. Through improved accessibility, participation, and engagement, the church will attract more visitors and increase community involvement, leading to long-term financial sustainability.

Revd Gail Rogers, Vicar of St Laurence Church, Alvechurch said: "We are thrilled to have received this support from The National Lottery Heritage Fund. Thanks to money raised by National Lottery players we can restore and preserve our historic church tower and clock face, through which we aim to increase community engagement, and ensure the long-term viability of St Laurence Church as both a cultural landmark, a place of worship and a community hub.



Our chapel prayer space will also be open for private reflection, and we will offer battery candles for anyone who wishes to place one around our Angel of Love in the churchyard. This evening is intended to be a peaceful and supportive environment for those who seek a moment of solace.

Radical Hospitality: A Call to Inclusive Church

In September, we launched our commitment as a faith community to exploring welcome and hospitality using the Inclusive Church resources to guide us. Here is an adapted version of Revd Gail's sermon as she encouraged us to enter into this new phase of growing together with generous and loving hearts, trusting in the transforming power of the Holy Spirit to lead us.

As we begin our journey exploring what it means to be an Inclusive Church, we are reminded of the radical hospitality we are called to show. Inclusive Church is a network that believes in a church where every person is welcomed and celebrated, stating:

"The Inclusive Church network believes in a Church which welcomes and serves all people in the name of Jesus Christ in a way which is scripturally faithful; seeks to proclaim the Gospel afresh for each generation; and which, in the power of the Holy Spirit, allows all people to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Jesus Christ."

The Scripture passages from Romans 15:1-13 and Luke 14:1, 12-23 provide a powerful foundation for this vision. In Romans, we are urged to bear with one another's weaknesses and to accept one another just as Christ accepted us. It's a call for unity across differences, reminding us that Christ's love is for all people—regardless of background, strength, or vulnerability.

In Luke, Jesus challenges us to practice hospitality that goes beyond reciprocity. We are called to welcome those who are often excluded. The parable of the Great Banquet paints a picture of God's realm where everyone, especially the marginalised, has a place at the table.

These passages urge us to reflect on who we might be unintentionally excluding in our church and communities. Whether through barriers of ability, race, gender, neurodiversity, mental health, poverty, or sexuality, we are called to widen our embrace, welcoming everyone with the same love that we ourselves have received.

As a church, we are committing to explore these areas over the next year. We will focus on the themes of **disability**, **neurodiversity**, **mental health**, **sexuality**, **poverty**, **gender**, **and ethnicity**, both in our worship and through midweek discussions. We will reflect on what it means to live out the radical welcome of God, seeking to be a place where everyone, without exception, is truly included.

May we be open to the guidance of the Spirit, learning to embody God's inclusive love in all we do, creating a community that welcomes and celebrates each individual as they are.
