REVD GAIL WRITES...

As we enter into the summer months, there are three things on my mind. The General Election, fundraising initiatives (of which there are three we are needing to pay attention to at St Laurence Church) and summer breaks. How does the Christian faith speak into these and inform how we are called to respond and encourage others to respond to?

In the gospel of Matthew, chapter 5 verses 13-16 Christians are called to be salt and light in the world. These metaphors convey important aspects of Christian identity and mission. Being salt and light means living out one's faith in a way that preserves and enhances goodness in the world, illuminates truth and hope, and serves as a visible, guiding example of God's love and righteousness.

Participating in elections is a way to influence society positively and advocate for policies that reflect Christian values such as justice, compassion, and the dignity of all people. To do this with integrity we need to be informed voters, understanding the issues and candidates, and seeking guidance through prayer and biblical principles.

In the Letter 1 Timothy, the Bible encourages prayer for leaders and those in authority and during election seasons we are urged to pray for wisdom and discernment in choosing leaders who will govern justly and righteously.

We also know that elections can be divisive. As Christians we are called to promote unity and respect for others, even those with differing views, maintaining a Christ-like attitude of love and grace. As we approach the 4th July, I pray that we can all hold onto the integrity of God who is love and use our vote to support policies that support the flourishing of all people and the communities that we live. Please do go and vote.

Fundraising is big on our agenda here at St Laurence, we need to raise money for our general fund which pays for the day to day bills and activities of our work and ministry. The income for our Churchyard maintenance fund doesn't cover the outgoings and we are still needing to raise funds for the essential maintenance and upgrade needed on our organ. Churches are charities, we don't receive any outside or government funding to cover our responsibility of maintaining the church building, the churchyard, and the cost of our mission and ministry. Apart from a small percentage of the fees from weddings and funerals we are only sustained via the generosity of others, of people like you who committed to supporting us through donations. This can be a one-off donation, a regular weekly, monthly or annual donation, all are gratefully received and much needed for the sustainability of our future.

Giving through our general QR code, plate giving in church, cash donations points, which can be found in The Ark and in church alongside our contactless machine will support our General Fund. If you would like to donate to the churchyard fund we have a separate QR for that, likewise for the organ fund. If you would like to donate by cash you can do so by writing the name of the fund on an envelope with your donation inside. We also have our sponsor and organ pipe to encourage donations here, see the article about this inside this edition of Grapevine. The Bible encourages generosity and cheerful giving (2 Corinthians 9:7) and our fundraising efforts should reflect these principles, promoting a spirit of generosity within the wider community of which we serve. Generosity will be lived out differently amongst us, some able to offer more than others, but no donation is too large or too small, what reflects the love and grace of God is the generosity and cheerfulness of the donation.

Finally, with all this going on, I am looking forward to a break. Summer breaks can be seen as an extended Sabbath, a time for rest and renewal. The Bible emphasises the importance of rest and summer can be a season to rejuvenate physically, mentally, and spiritually. It's an opportunity to spend quality time with family and friends, deepening relationships and fostering community, reflecting the biblical value of fellowship. With the longer days we may have more time to do things we wouldn't usually do, so they may also be a time for service, participating more within local community projects, embodying the call to serve others. Whatever you are doing this summer, may you know some rest and renewal.

In this edition of Grapevine there is lots of information about our upcoming Heritage Day in September, save the date! This year we are doing a Prize Draw and already have some fantastic prizes to be won, do buy your tickets and sell some for us too if you are able. All money will go into our General Fund. There is also lots of information about the life of St Laurence Church and the community of Alvechurch, take a look and come and join in. A warm and friendly welcome awaits you.

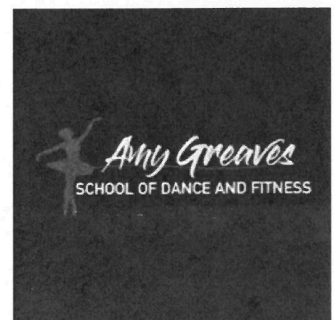

What can I expect when I come?

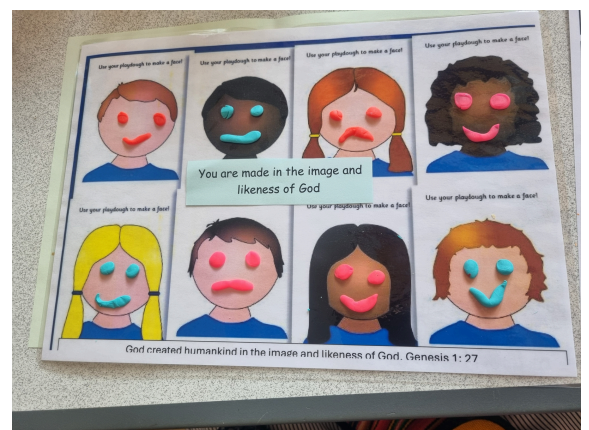
A warm welcome, delicious breakfast pastries, followed by friendship, conversation and worship. and an invitation to be all that you have been created to be.

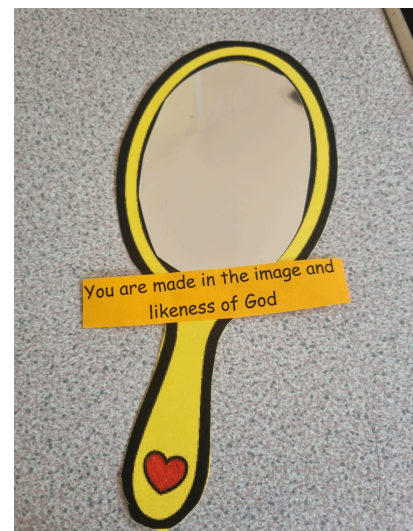

IMPORTANT NOTICE ABOUT ACCESS TO ST LAURENCE CHURCH AND THE ARK

WORCESTERSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL PUBLIC NOTICE

Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984

(U23242 School Lane, Alvechurch) (Temporary Closure) and The County of Worcester (School Lane, Alvechurch) (One-Way) Order 1958 (Temporary Suspension) Order 2024

Proposed Order: to close that part of U23242 School Lane from its junction with C2001 Bear Hill for a distance of 80 metres in a north-easterly direction and to temporarily suspend The County of Worcester (School Lane, Alvechurch) (One-Way) Order 1958 to allow two-way traffic to be able to access residents and businesses for the duration of the Order.

Reason: Replacement gas main by Cadent Gas.

Exemptions: to permit access to any land or premises fronting the highway affected where there is no other form of access; and to allow the works to be undertaken.

Alternative route: C2001 Bear Hill, C2291 Swan Street and vice versa.

**Maximum duration: 18 Months. Anticipated duration: 15 days (24hrs)
Commencing: 15 July 2024**

ROGER WARDLE WRITES...

What makes your heart sing?

The relevance of this question should become clearer later, but suffice to say I am at the time of life when I often find myself mulling over big and difficult questions. Questions like, “Why am I on this earth?”, “What have I achieved in life?”; and, yes, “How will I be remembered?”

It is generally thought that as people age, they become wiser. Have I developed the ability of ‘judging rightly and following the soundest course of action, based on knowledge, experience and understanding’? I’m not sure that I have, but I try to keep learning (these days, usually from my grandchildren) and I find myself increasingly noting words of wisdom expounded by others. Things like, “it’s not the years in your life, it’s the life in your years,” and “as you get older, keep saying yes” (to new experiences and opportunities).

It was at one of my more reflective moments I heard on the radio someone of a certain age say, “as you get older do what makes your heart sing.” It caused me to stop and think what exactly does that phrase mean. In my life I have been fortunate enough to enjoy many special or magical moments; my wedding day; witnessing the birth of my children; smelling the fragrance of a particularly beautiful rose, etc. etc.

But there are some moments which transcend even the magical. Moments when not just your heart starts racing, but when where you are and what you are experiencing lifts you up to another level entirely. When you are drawn into a spiritual dimension, when you are literally unable to find words to describe how you feel. Other than you feel your heart singing for joy.

You may have heard of a particular location being described as a ‘thin place’. It may be a religious building, it may be outside in a lovely garden, it may be a mountain top, but a place where you can experience the nearness of God, a place where earth and heaven meet. I think that may well be, for me, a similar experience to when my heart starts singing, except the place itself may not be important. It’s your emotional and spiritual connection with what you are experiencing that is critical. The common denominator of these two experiences, for me, is the presence of God.

When my heart really does sing is not only when I experience God’s presence, his nearness, but also feel God’s love. As part of the repertoire of Alvechurch Community Choir of which I am a member, as well as in church services, I/we sing this song:-

Love I give to you,
I give to you, my love.
Let it flow to one another,
Let it flow, let it flow.

May God’s love flow to you in the same way as it has to me. When it does any wisdom I have gained over the years tells me that you will find your heart singing too.

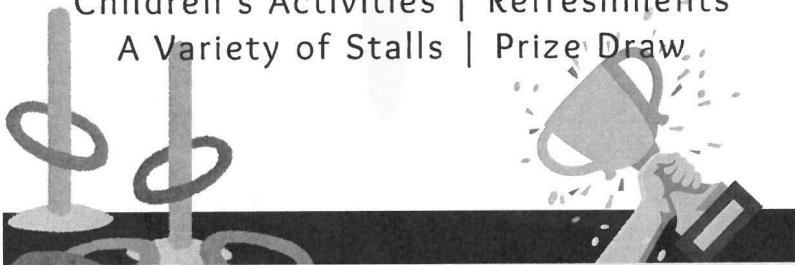

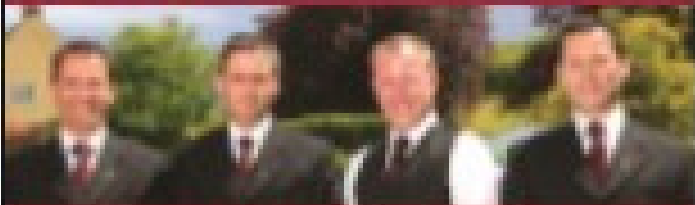

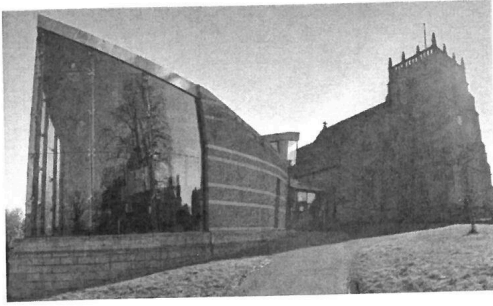

D Day

Alvechurch and Rowney Green Remembers



Rowney Green Memorial to the Canadian Airmen who lost their lives in a plane crash in nearby fields.

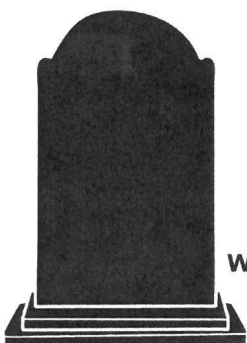

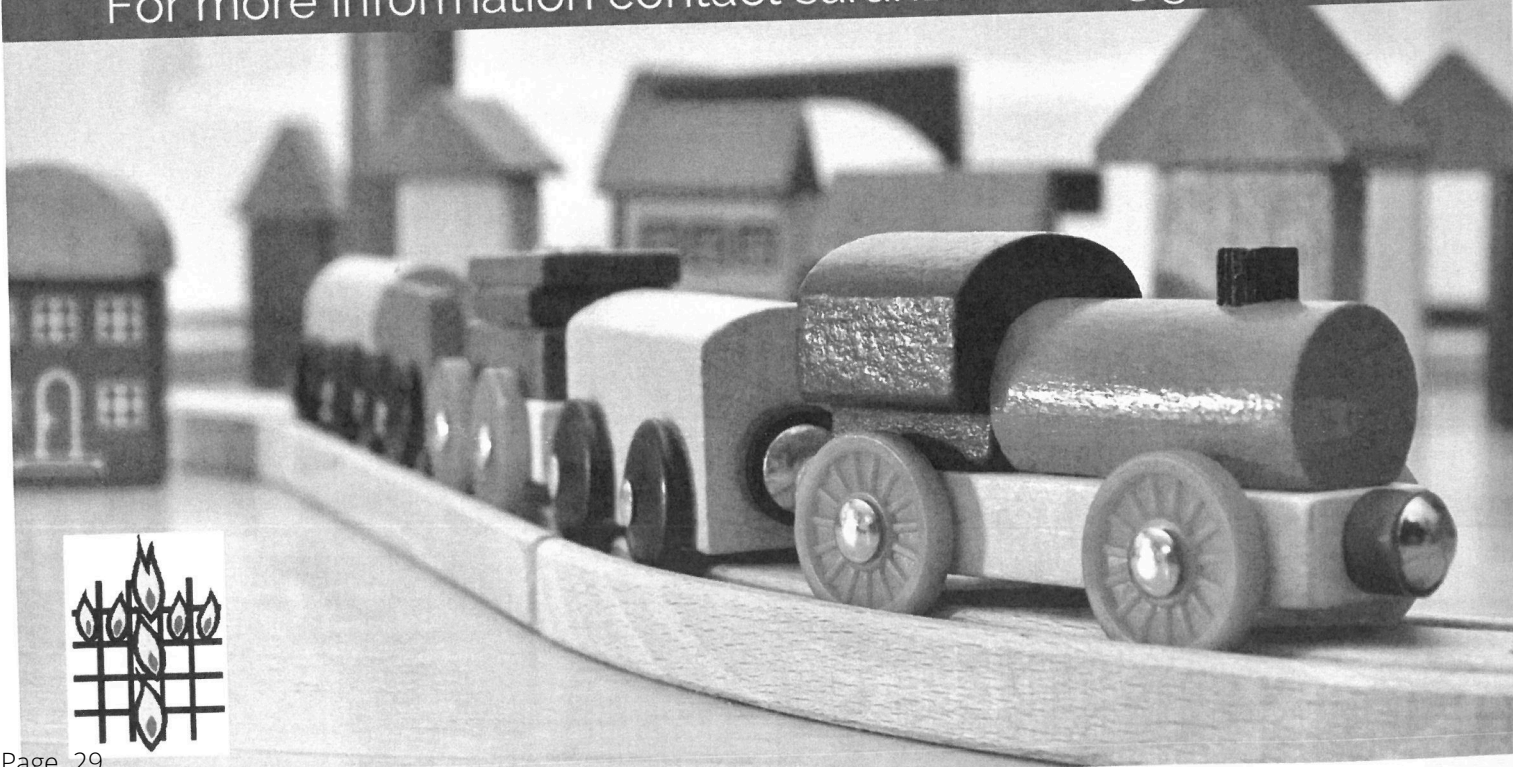

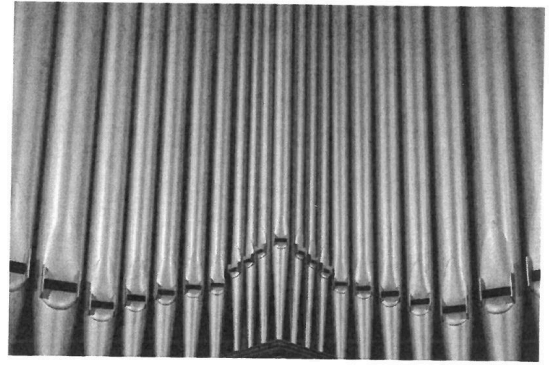

In 1971 the church organ was rebuilt by Thomas Sheffield of Solihull and placed on a free standing gallery in the north aisle. This instrument replaced an earlier one built by the Hill Organ Company at the beginning of the twentieth century. The present organ has 1,348 pipes of which 180 came from the old instrument.

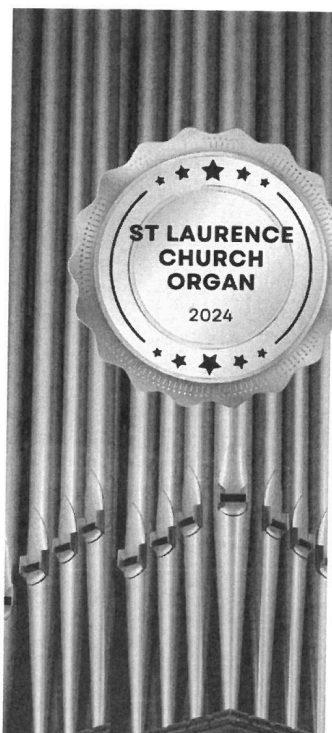
As part of our campaign to raise money for essential works and upgrade our organ we are launching, 'Sponsor a pipe!'
